ORDER

WHEREAS, the National Disaster Management Authority (NDMA) in exercise of their powers under section 6(2)(i) of the Disaster Management Act, 2005 vide their Orders dated 24.03.2020, 14.04.2020 and 01.05.2020 had directed the National Executive Committee (NEC) to take lockdown measures so as to contain the spread of COVID-19 in the Country.

AND WHEREAS, in exercise of the powers under section 6(2) (i) of the Disaster Management Act, 2005, NDMA has issued an order number 1-29/2020-PP dated 17.05.2020 directing the Chairperson, NEC that lockdown measures to contain the spread of COVID-19 be continued to be implemented in all parts of the Country, for a further period upto 31.05.2020,

AND WHEREAS: in exercise of the powers, conferred under Section 10(2) (i) of the Disaster Management Act, 2005 the Union Home Secretary-cum-Chairperson NEC, vide his Order No.40-3/2020-DM-I(A)dt.30.05.2020 of Ministry of Home Affairs, Govt. of India has issued directions for strict implementation of lockdown measures as per the guidelines for a period upto 30.06.2020,

AND WHEREAS: the state Govt. vide Order No.3057/ R & DM dt.1.6.2020 of SRC & ACS Odisha has also extended the lock down in the entire state of Odisha till midnight of 30.06.2020

NOW, THEREFORE, in pursuance of above mentioned Orders of Ministry of Home Affairs, Govt. of India & Order of SRC & ACS Odisha, we being the empowered Officer as per Disaster Management Act-2005, in supersession of this Office Order No.6626/Emg. dt.19.05.2020 do hereby order that the lockdown will be extended **for a period upto 30.06.2020** in the territory of Revenue District of Bhadrak and with the following stipulations:

1. Lockdown limited to Containment Zones

- i. Lockdown shall continue to remain in force in the Containment Zones till 30th June, 2020.
- ii. Containment Zones will be demarcated as per the guidelines of MoHFW, Government of India/ H&FW Department of Government of Odisha.
- iii. In Containment Zones, only essential activities shall be allowed. There shall be strict perimeter control to ensure that there is no movement of people in or out of these zones,

except for medical emergencies and for maintaining supply of essential goods and services. There shall be intensive contact tracing, house-to-house surveillance, and other clinical interventions, as required. Guidelines of MoHFW shall be taken into consideration for the above purpose.

2. Establishments/ activities are not allowed till 30th June, 2020:

- i. Religious places/ places of worship for public.
- ii. Shopping malls
- iii. Cinema halls, gymnasiums, swimming pools, entertainment parks, theatres, bars and auditoriums, assembly halls and similar places.
- iv. Social/ political/ sports/ entertainment/ academic/ cultural/ religious functions and other large congregations.

3. Following activities are allowed with restriction

- I. Hotels will be allowed to operate up to 30% capacity. Restaurant service will be open only for in-house guests.
- II. Restaurants and Hotels are permitted for home delivery/ takeaways of food.
- III. Schools, colleges, other educational/ training/ coaching institutions, etc. will remain closed till 31st July, 2020.
- IV. **Salons, Spas, Beauty Parlours and Barber shops** shall ensure all safety precautions, disinfection and sanitization before and after service of each customer.
- V. **Gatherings:** Public gatherings/ congregations of **more than 7 persons** are prohibited.
- VI. **Marriage related gatherings:** Number of guests **not to exceed 50.**
- VII. **Funeral/ last rites related gatherings:** Number of persons **not to exceed 20.**

4. Directives for COVID-19 Management

The following Directives for COVID-19 Management shall be strictly followed throughout the District::

- i. I. **Face coverings:** Wearing of face cover is compulsory in public places; in workplaces; and during transport.
- ii. II. **Social Distancing: Individual** must maintain a minimum distance of 6 feet in public places. Shops will ensure physical distancing among customers. The owner of the shop **shall be liable** for any violation.
- III. **Spitting in public places** will be punishable with fine, as prescribed in accordance with laws, rules or regulations.
- iv. **Consumption of liquor, paan, gutka, tobacco etc.** in public places is prohibited.

5. Screening & hygiene:

Provision for thermal scanning, hand wash and sanitizer will be made at all entry and exit points and common areas.

Frequent sanitization of entire workplace, common facilities and all points which come into human contact e.g. door handles, etc., will be ensured, including between shifts.

Social distancing: All persons in charge of work places will ensure adequate distance between workers, adequate gaps between shifts, staggering the lunch breaks of staff, etc.

6 Unrestricted movement of persons and goods

There shall be no restriction on inter-State and intra-State movement of persons and goods. **No permission/ approval/ e-permit will be required for such movements.**

- i. **Intra State Buses, City Buses, Taxis** (including cabs by aggregators like Ola, Uber, etc.), **Auto Rickshaws** and other **Passenger Vehicles**, are allowed to operate with up to sitting capacity of the vehicle, as mentioned in the Registration Certificate.
- ii. Movement by passenger trains and Shramik special trains; domestic passenger air travel; movement of Indian Nationals stranded outside the country and of specified persons to travel abroad; evacuation of foreign nationals; and sign-on and sign-off of Indian seafarers will continue to be regulated as per SOPs issued by Govt. of India.

7. Safety and Protection of vulnerable persons

Outdoor movement of the following category of people is prohibited, except for essential and health purposes till 31st August, 2020 .

- a. Persons above 65 years of age
- b. persons with co-morbidities
- c. pregnant women
- d. children below the age of 10 years

8.. Use of Aarogya Setu

- (i) Aarogya Setu enables early identification of potential risk of infection, and thus acts as a shield for individuals and the community.
- (ii) With a view to ensuring safety in offices and work places, employers on best effort basis should ensure that Aarogya Setu is installed by all employees having compatible mobile phones.
- (iii) District authorities may advise individuals to install the Aarogya Setu application on compatible mobile phones and regularly update their health status on the app. This will facilitate timely provision of medical attention to those individuals who are at risk.

Penal provisions

Any person violating these measures will be liable to be proceeded against as per the provisions of Section 51 to 60 of the Disaster Management Act, 2005, besides legal action under Section 188 of the IPC, and other legal provisions as applicable. Extracts of these penal provisions
