Whereas, in pursuance of the directions issued by the National Executive Committee, Government of India under the Disaster Management Act, 2005, the Government Odisha, vide Revenue & Disaster Management (Disaster Management) Department Notification No.3057/R&DM(DM) dated 01.06.2020, had extended the lock down in the entire State of Odisha with stipulations mentioned therein, with a view to contain the spread of COVID-19 pandemic, till midnight of 30.06.2020;

And Whereas, in pursuance of the directions of the National Disaster Management Authority (NOMA), the National Executive Committee, in exercise of the powers conferred under Section 10(2)(1) of the Disaster Management Act, 2005, has issued revised guidelines vide Ministry of Home Affairs, Government of India order No.40-3/2020-DM-I(A) dated 29.06.2020 to extend the lockdown in Containment Zones up to 31.07.2020, and to re-open more activities in a calibrated manner in areas outside Containment Zones;

AND WHEREAS: the State Govt. vide Order No.3856/ R & DM dt.30.6.2020 of SRC & ACS Odisha has also extended the lock down in the entire state of Odisha till midnight of 31.07.2020

NOW, THEREFORE, in pursuance of above mentioned Orders, we being the empowered Officer as per Disaster Management Act-2005, in supersession of this

Office Order No.7165/Emg. dt.01.06.2020 do hereby order that the lockdown will be extended **for a period upto 31.07.2020** in the territory of Revenue District of Bhadrak and along with the following stipulations:

1. Lockdown limited to Containment Zones

- i. Lockdown shall continue to remain in force in the Containment Zones till 31st. July, 2020.
- ii. Containment Zones will be demarcated as per the guidelines of MoHFW, Government of India/H&FW Department of Government of Odisha.
- iii. In the Containment Zones, only essential activities shall be allowed. There shall be strict perimeter control to ensure that there is no movement of people in or out of these zones, except for medical emergencies and for maintaining supply of essential goods and services. There shall be intensive contact tracing, house- to-house surveillance, and other clinical interventions, as required. Guidelines of MoHFW shall be taken into consideration for the above purpose.

2. Establishment / activities are not allowed till 31st. July, 2020

- (i) Religious places of worship for public.
- (ii) Cinema halls, gymnasiums, swimming pools, entertainment complexes, theatres, auditoriums, assembly halls and similar places.
- (iii) Social / political /sports / entertainment / academic / cultural / religious functions and other large congregations.
- (iv) Schools, colleges, other educational/ training/ coaching institutions, etc. will remain closed for the purpose of teaching till 31st August, 2020. However, conduct of examinations and evaluation, etc. and specific government training programs as would be approved shall be permitted.

3. Following activities are allowed with restrictions

- a. **Hotels / Restaurants will be allowed to operate subject to the following conditions.**
- i. Entrance to have mandatory hand hygiene (sanitizer dispenser) and thermal screening provisions.
 - ii. Only asymptomatic staff and guests shall be allowed, they must wear face masks, gloves and ensure social distancing norms.
 - iii. Proper crowd management in the hotel as well as in outside premises like parking lots-du ly following social distancing norms shall be ensured. Large gatherings/congregations continue to remain prohibited.
 - iv. Preferably separate entry and exits for guests, staff and goods/supplies shall be organized. Specific markings may be made with sufficient distance to manage the queue and ensure social distancing in the premises.
 - x. Details of the guest (travel history, medical condition etc.) along with ID and self- declaration form must be provided by the guest at the reception.
 - xi. Posters/standees/AV media on preventive measures about COVID-19 to be displayed prominently.
 - xii. Hotels must adopt contactless processes like QR code, online forms, digital payments like e-wallet etc. for both check-in and check-out. Luggage of guests should be disinfected before sending the luggage to rooms. Guests who are at higher risk i.e. those who are older, pregnant or those who have underlying medical conditions are advised to take extra precautions.
- b. **Restaurant service in Hotels will be open for in-house guests Restaurants and Hotels are permitted for home delivery/ takeaways of food. Dhabas along National and State Highways/ Major roads for takeaway only.**

- c. **Salons, Spas, Beauty Parlours and Barber shops** shall ensure all safety precautions, disinfection and sanitization before and after service of each customer. The owner/ manager shall be liable for any violation.
- d. Marriage related gatherings: Number of guests not to exceed 50.
- e. Funeral/ last rites related gatherings: Number of persons not to exceed 20.

4. General Directives for COVID-19 Management

The following general directives for COVID-19 Management shall be strictly followed throughout the District:

- a. **Face coverings:** Wearing of face cover is compulsory in public places; in workplaces; and during transport.
- b. **Social distancing:** Individuals must maintain a minimum distance of 6 feet in public places.
- c. **Shops will ensure physical distancing among customers. The owner/ manager of the shop shall be liable for any violation. Shops/commercial establishments shall be closed for a period of one week, if COVID-19 guidelines are not followed apart from imposition of fines as would be decided by the concerned local authorities.**
- d. **Gatherings:** Public gatherings/ congregations of more than 7 persons are prohibited.
- e. Spitting in public places will be punishable with fine, as prescribed in accordance with laws, rules or regulations
- f. Consumption of liquor, paan, gutka/ tobacco, etc. in public places is prohibited.

5. Unrestricted movement of persons and goods

- a. There shall be no restriction on inter-State and intra-State movement of persons and goods. **No permission / approval / e- permit/ passes will be required for such movements. However,**

additional restrictions would be issued by district administration from time to time for mandatory quarantine for people coming / returning from HOTSPOT areas.

- b. Intra State Buses, City Buses, Taxis (including cabs by aggregators like Ola, Uber, etc.), Auto Rickshaws and other Passenger Vehicles, are allowed to operate with up to sitting capacity of the vehicle, as mentioned in the Registration Certificate.
- c. Movement by passenger trains and Shramik special trains domestic passenger air travel; movement of Indian Nationals stranded outside the country and of specified persons to travel abroad with restriction provided in the guidelines.

6. Safety and Protection of vulnerable persons

The following categories of people are advised against outdoor movement, except for essential and health purposes till 31st August, 2020.

- c. Persons above 65 years of age
- d. persons with co-morbidities
- e. pregnant women
- f. children below the age of 10 years

7. Use of Aarogya Setu

- (i) *Aarogya Setu* enables early identification of potential risk of infection, and thus acts as a shield for individuals and the community. Hence all are advised to install Aarogya Setu App. in their Android Mobile in order to contain the spread of COVID-19.

8. Night Curfew and weekly shutdown

There shall be imposition of curfew from 9.00 pm to 5.00 AM. There shall be weekly shutdown on all Sundays during the month of July. However, all

shops, commercial establishments, offices, institutions shall close by 7.00PM every day till 31st July, unless otherwise specified by district/local administration and movement of individuals shall remain prohibited from **9.00PM to 5.00AM** except for the following essential activities.

- District and Municipal Administration/ Police/ Government Officials on duty
- Doctors, Medical/ Paramedical Staff (Govt. & Private)
- Staff of IT & ITeS Companies on production their I-card
- Any person, in case of medical or other emergency
- Owner/ staff of Chemist shops
- All industrial units
- All construction activities
- Movement of Public Transport, private vehicles and taxis (including cabs by aggregators like Ola, Uber, etc.) to and from railway station and bus terminals/ stands/ stops, for facilitating movement of passengers by rail and road.
- Operation of hotels and hospitality units, including their associated offices, movement of staff and associated personnel
- Dhabas along National and State Highways/ Major roads for takeaway
- Medical store to open till 10.00PM & medical stores within the premises of Hospital will open 24 X 7.

9. Penal provisions

Any person violating these measures will be liable to be proceeded against



in accordance with the provisions of Section 51 to 60 of the Disaster Management Act, 2005, besides legal action under Section 188 of the PC, and other legal provisions as applicable.

This order will come into force with effect from 01.07.2020.
